20. Anders Svensson Hall

* 1828-06-01 Alster parish, Värmland, Sweden.

He moved from Grava parish to Alsters parish in 1847 to work as a farmhand on the farm Rönningen.

In 1848 he move to the farm Hallanda to work as a farmhand. In Hallanda he met his wife to be, Stina Nilsson (No 21), who worked there as a maid.

When he in 1849 became the soldier Anders Hall and move to the soldiers croft No 87 at Hasselbol, Alsters parish, Stina moved with him to work as a maid for him. The same year they had their first child, the son Emmanuel. They married in 1850-03-31.

He was dismissed in 1876. The following year he was followed by his son Nils Gustaf who became the new soldier in Hasselbol.

When his son and his family moved to Grava parish in 1889. He and his wife became crofters in Hasselbol.

The soldier in Hasselbol after his son Nils Gustaf became Hugo Spångberg Hall from Stockholm who in 1891 married his daughter Maria Lovisa.

With Anders and Stina lived also their daughter Emma's son Axel Edvard, born 1887-11-19 in Alsters parish. His mother Emma had earlier emigrated to USA. Axel Edvard emigrated alone to USA in 1894, seven years old.

He lived as a crofter in Hasselbol until he died in 1914.
